BIRD COUNT LEADERS - THINGS TO REMEMBER

1. Fill your tank with gas the day before the count.
2. Checklists and Data Sheets - Clip Boards are helpful. If Team separates you will need additional copies of both.
3. Tape Recorder with GOOD Batteries - Screech Owl tape.
4. Binoculars and Scope.
5. Handy Items: Insect Repellant, Flashlights, Sun Screen.
6. Be sure to include either your E-Mail Address or your Physical Address on the Team Data sheet if you want a copy of the result.
7. Sack Lunch if you plan to eat in the field.
8. Call all team members well before the day of the count and inform them of the morning meeting place.
9. Please get permission before Birding on private land. It is helpful to go over your area prior to the count.
10. Follow unusual Bird sighting as per instructions. Document and/or photograph.
11. Keep close track of start/end times. Record miles and hours accumulated by Car, Boat, and Foot on form!
12. Citrus County Audubon Society will be funding this years CBC. Nothing will be collected from the participants.

The count will be tallied at the Crystal River State Park Preserve Office.

Please arrive not later than 5:30.
Refreshments will be served.
